Effective 1/26/09, the Importer Security Filing (ISF) & additional carrier requirements (10+2) went into effect. This was an interim period to allow Importers time to comply with the rule. Full enforcement of the rule will go into effect on 1/26/2010. Exempt from the rule is bulk cargo, ro ro cargo & air freight.

Importers are responsible to comply with the rule. Effective 1/26/2010, if a filing is not submitted to U.S. Customs & Border Protection timely or accurately, a penalty of \$5,000.00 will be issued to the Importer regardless. The cargo could also be denied entry into the U.S.

U.S. Customs & Border Protection has been reviewing ISF filings since implementation and is looking at this information to determine completeness & timeliness. If you are showing an attempt at compliance since 1/26/09, this may be taken into consideration if a penalty is issued.

Household goods are now exempt from Bonding. If this should change, we will advise you.

It is very important to select a responsible Agent to handle the Importer Security Filing on your behalf. Pride Intl., Inc. can handle the filing & we will charge a fee for this service.

The following information must be provided to enable us to file the ISF:

- 1. Importer name, address & number (Social Security number for U.S. residents. Passport number for non U.S. residents including the country, date of issuance & date of birth)
- 2. Consignee number (same as above)
- 3. Seller (owner) name & address (individuals name & last foreign address)
- 4. Buyer (owner) name & address (individuals name & complete U.S. address)
- 5. Ship To Party (individuals name & complete U.S. address)
- 6. Manufacturer (Supplier) (individual's names & last foreign address)
- 7. Country of Origin (Country from individual's last foreign address)
- 8. Commodity HTS code (Pride can provide this)

- 9. Container Stuffing Location (the name & physical location where the goods were stuffed into the container. For break bulk shipments (less than a container load) the name & address of the physical location where the goods were made "Ship Ready" must be provided.
- 10. Consolidator (the name & address of the party who stuffed the container or arranged for the stuffing of the container. For break bulk cargo (less than a container load), the name & address of the party who made the goods "Ship Ready" or the party who arranged for the goods to be made "Ship Ready."
- 11. Bill of Lading Number (provide the Shipping Co. bill of lading number & the house bill of lading number)

The above data elements must be provided to U.S. Customs & border Protection no later than 24 hours before the cargo is loaded aboard a vessel destined for the U.S. There are no exceptions. If the filing is not provided within this time frame, a penalty of \$5,000.00 will incur. If any of the above information should change, the filing must be corrected with U.S. Customs & border Protection.

We strongly urge you to contact your suppliers and partners overseas to make them aware of this rule.

Bulk and Break Bulk Cargo

An Importer Security Filing is not required for bulk cargo.

For break bulk cargo that is exempt from the 24 hour prior to lading timing requirement for 24 Hour Rule purposes, the Importer Security Filing is required 24 hours prior to arrival.



- Importer of Record #: For U.S. Residents, a Social Security Number may be issuance and a date of birth must be provided In the alternative (and for non U.S. residents), a passport number, with country of provided as long as it has been recorded by CBP (see CBP Form 5106).
- Consignee #: May be the same as Importer of Record #.
- Seller (Owner): Owner's name and last foreign address
- Buyer (Owner): Owner's name and new address in the United States
- Ship To Party: Generally, the importer's new address in the United States
- Manufacturer (Supplier) name/address: N/A as the system will default to show the Seller (Owner) name/address information again.

- Commodity HTS-6: N/A as the system will default to 9804.00 for household goods and personal effects
